pdf: I am having a problem with my simulation code. I am simulating the history of a radioactive source (alpha particles) in a metal plate with a constant temperature. The metal plate has some thickness and I want to measure the alpha particles emitted by the radioactive source, and then calculate the energy and time of the emitted alpha particle with the help of a fitting curve function. For the energy part, I have set up a collimator window with a size that varies with time. And the energy window changes with time, so I am using a sine wave function to simulate it. My problem is the time window. Because the sine function changes with time, the spectrum will also be changed with time and, thus, the alpha particles will have different energy and time as the time window changes.
